A new position for an Itinerant Special Education for CMZ / SES was approved. This was necessary due to increased special ed populations in these buildings.

A contract for Speech and Language Pathology services was approved. This followed unsuccessful efforts to bring a speech-language pathologist on staff. The contract approved was the best offered and the individual has the needed credentials for Medicaid reimbursement.

The Board approved the use of a letter of credit from he Federal Home Land Bank to secure all deposits at Forcht Bank. (This is a new way to insure district deposits.)

OLD BUSINESS: The Board briefly discussed a proposal that had been presented during the previous work session for energy improvements throughout the district. The Board brought questions regarding cost and what financial obligations we would have if we selected only portions of the proposal. Mr. Linder will follow-up.
