NKU Grant County Scholarship

The purpose of this \$1,000 scholarship is to assist deserving students with financial aid toward their college education.

This scholarship is awarded to an eligible incoming freshman who is taking at least two classes at the NKU Grant County. The scholarship is funded with proceeds from fundraisers and individual donations. This scholarship is managed by Northern Kentucky University Grant County.

Scholarship Eligibility Criteria

- Must be a 2021 graduate of Gallatin, Grant, Owen, Pendleton, Walton Verona, or Williamstown High School
- Complete the attached NKU Grant County Scholarship Application
- Must have sufficient academic potential, based on the findings of the selection committee, to succeed at the next level of training
- Must present evidence of acceptance to Northern Kentucky University
- Must take at least two classes per semester at the NKU Grant County Center
 - ("\$500 per semester will be applied to the student's NKU account once enrollment is verified. Student must have satisfactory course completion and maintain a 2.0 GPA to receive spring disbursement.)

Deadline

Application must be received by <u>4:00 p.m. on Friday, March 26, 2021</u>, in the Counseling Office of your high school or delivered to NKU Grant County at 390 N Main Street – Williamstown, KY.

Release of Information

The scholarship recipient's name and photograph will be announced publicly, in the Grant County News and potentially other public news outlets. By applying for this scholarship, the applicant acknowledges an understanding and approval of using photographs and announcement publically.
